Unison Confession of Sin

O God of grace, You have imputed our sin to Christ, our Substitute, and have imputed His righteousness to us, clothing each of us with a bridegroom's robe, decking us with jewels of holiness. 68. How many sacraments has Christ instituted in the New Testament?

Two: Holy Baptism and the Holy Supper.

69. How is it signified and sealed unto you in Holy Baptism, that you have part in the one sacrifice of Christ on the cross? Thus: that Christ has appointed this outward washing with water, and has joined to it this promise, that I am washed with His blood and Spirit from the pollution of my soul, that is, from all my sins, as certainly, as I am washed outwardly with water, whereby commonly the filthiness of the body is taken away.

70. What is it to be washed with the blood and Spirit of Christ? It is to have the forgiveness of sins from God, through grace, for the sake of Christ's blood, which He shed for us in His sacrifice on the cross; and also, to be renewed by the Holy Ghost, and sanctified to be members of Christ, that so we may more and more die unto sin, and lead holy and blameless lives. Amen.
